Last week students were introduced to the theme of forces. Over the course of the week they conducted a brainstorm session to identify as many 'forces' as they could from natural, and man-made/social sources. Then, they finished out the week taking a close look at the power of persuasion as a force to convince others to follow an idea. Using six (6) concepts they created posters to sell their ideas to their classmates.

Over the next three weeks students will be part of theme groups exploring forces in physical science (i.e.: Newton's Laws of Motion, Forces in Motion, Changes in Motion (Recognizing that objects can be moved without being touched (Gravity, Static Electricity, Magnetism...)), natural science (i.e.: plate tectonics and Pangea), and social forces in play through advertising (i.e.: TV, radio and print advertising).

Notes from the Nurse for November

Is It a Cold or the Flu?

The flu has arrived in Homer. Across the nation, it has been low activity for the flu season so far. The symptoms between the common cold and the “flu” can have some similarities and can be confusing. The cold and flu are both respiratory illnesses, but they are caused by different types of viruses with different symptoms. This chart will help describe the difference between the two.

<u>Signs and Symptoms</u>	<u>Influenza</u>	<u>Cold</u>
Symptom onset	Abrupt	Gradual
Fever	Usual; lasts 3-4 days	Rare
Aches	Usual; often severe	Slight
Chills	Fairly common	Uncommon
Fatigue, weakness	Usual	Sometimes
Sneezing	Sometimes	Common
Stuffy nose	Sometimes	Common
Sore throat	Sometimes	Common
Chest discomfort, cough	Common; can be severe	Mild to moderate; hacking cough
Headache	Common	Rare

Antibiotics do not work with the common cold or the flu. Rest, fluids, and good nutrition are the best treatments for both. If your child has a fever, is coughing a lot, has diarrhea and/or vomiting, they need to stay home from school AND sports to rest and heal.

Prevention is the key. Stay away from sick people. Stay home if you are sick. Sneeze and cough into your sleeve. Get adequate sleep. Drink plenty of water. Eat healthy food. And remember-wash, wash, wash your hands! Flu shots are available at all health care providers and at some local pharmacies in Homer.

Community Emergency Response Team (CERT)

The Kenai Peninsula Borough, Office of Emergency Management is pleased to announce that the next Community Emergency Response Team (CERT) team training will be held beginning Tuesday November 1 through November 12 in Homer. This course is designed to prepare residents that do not have prior emergency response background on basic skills to keep themselves, their families, and their neighbors prepared for, and safe during, an emergency such as fire, flood, earthquake, or other incident.

The course covers skills such as fire and utility control, disaster medical skills, light search and rescue, team organization, and disaster preparedness. Participants should expect a hands on course learning and practicing practical skills. Sessions are taught by emergency management professionals and other first responders, and will provide a comprehensive overview of these skills. CERT training is based on FEMA curriculum and is adapted for the unique conditions found on the Kenai Peninsula and Alaska

At the conclusion of the training, participants have the opportunity to join their local CERT team to be called upon to assist first responders during emergency or disaster conditions. CERT members have been used in the past to provide public information, staff telephone lines, perform evacuations, and many other functions.

Participants 13 and over are welcome in the class with parental consent. All materials will be provided, and there is no cost or obligation for the class. Exact class location in Homer will be announced. Class size is limited to 25 participants, and a minimum enrollment is required. Please see the detailed schedule below.
