Annual Holiday Gift Exchange



On Thursday, December 17th students in 3rd-6th grade will participate in our annual Holiday Gift Exchange. This is a fun time to exchange gifts amongst the whole school. What happens is that each student is asked to bring in a gift. The gift should be a gently used toy, game, book, homemade item, OR cost less than \$5.00. It should be wrapped but with no writing on it. We then compile the gifts and through a drawing the kids are given a number. They then choose an item from the compiled presents OR "steal" a present from someone else (think White Elephant style). Usually this is a highly anticipated activity that the students greatly enjoy. Each student ends up with a gift to keep or donate in some way. We encourage the students to think of this activity as more of a fun experience rather than receiving a gift.




Robotics on Wednesday afterschool


Robotic will continue this week from 3:15 - 4:15. There will be no afterschool robotics the week of November 14th.

Link Up Orchestra




